

PARKING ALONG SUMMERWOOD LANE, SEGARS LANE, MOSS ROAD AND ALSO ALL OUR NARROW LANES

In the past we have received concerns specifically about the three named roads above, but equally all our narrow lanes can be problematic for the same reasons, namely obstruction to pedestrians, wheelchair users, road users and Emergency Vehicles, caused by double parking and parking across pavements.

Please use the Memorial Hall car park whenever possible, for events at St Cuthbert's and the school run and please park on your own residential driveways wherever possible.

HALSALL WAR MEMORIAL PLAYING FIELD AND HALL TRUST

Halsall Parish Council is sole Trustee of the Trust which as a selffunding charity, no 521111 is regulated by the Charity Commission. It is different legal entity from Halsall Parish Council, and the councillors wear a different 'hat' when making decisions about the Trust.

We thank Dave Bond, the retiring Trust Secretary, and welcome Chris Pyne as the new Trust Secretary from 01/08/2022.

The Trust has upgraded the CCTV at the Hall to digital cameras, to improve the quality of recordings in car park area and we are installing Wi-Fi to provide a greater range of services to groups who use the Hall.

We hire our facilities to annual users such as the Cricket teams, Football teams, the Snooker Club and the Scouts for storage facilities. We hire to various weekly users such as Dog Training groups, Dance groups, Mums' fitness groups, as well as for ad hoc functions. We have recently defined a policy for Memorial Benches and are looking into the idea of Memorial Trees.

We rent a part of the Hall to the Village Bakehouse and thank Howard Smith the proprietor for his provision of such a popular hub for the Village, the friendly atmosphere in the café and the wonderful flower display outside. The Trust has approved a budget for providing flowers in front of the Hall which we hope will match his wonderful displays.

The Trust is looking into hosting more social events, luncheon clubs, quiz nights, family history/genealogy groups, local history, gardening clubs etc. so we would welcome any interested residents to contact any of us to let us know your views.

Because we are a self-funding charity, with support from grants for major projects from Halsall Parish Council, we are looking into the feasibility of adding a Gift Aid scheme to our charitable status in order to increase our receipts.



Gardener`s Corner

September at-a-glance

Not so long ago, September was the end of the season – time to put the garden to bed- but not anymore. Mild autumns allow us to continue growing plants that slot into the summer border to give you another month or two of colour & interest. Happy Gardening.

General Tasks

Keep watering, feeding & deadheading – it`s time consuming but it does pay off!

Cut back any perennial stems that have finished flowering –like Iris Sibirica- to tidy garden.

Get the compost going – clearing generates a huge amount of waste.

Repair broken lawn edges, bumps & hollows.

Make new lawns from seed but delay laying turf till October.

Plant or move evergreens so the roots can establish before the first frosts.

Clip hornbeam, beech, Leyland cypress & thuja hedges before the middle of the month.

Cut slow growing yew & box hedges now if you only want to do the job once each year.

Plant spring flowering bulbs.

Replace summer bedding as it comes to an end with plants for winter & spring interest.

Deadhead & protect dahlias- but allow them to blacken with the first frost before lifting.

Collect seed from perennials.

Walk round the garden & move any perennials or shrubs that need a different position.

Watch out for early frosts & move any tender plants under cover.

Plant spring cabbage.

Cut down asparagus foliage once it has turned yellow or buff (it may occur next month)

Pot up herbs such as chives, mint, basil, coriander & parsley.

Continue harvesting blackberries, early apple varieties – pears at the end of the month.

Reduce the watering & feeding of all greenhouse plants.

Continue to feed fish until the weather breaks.

Give a final light thinning-out of oxygenating plants, but only if necessary.
