



Update from Halsall School: October 2022

General

At present, we have 175 children on the school roll. This should hopefully provide a healthy school budget next April 2023 and help us to retain our present staffing levels. As we have a qualified teacher and 2 teaching assistants in each class, we are able to provide quality support for children's learning and cater for their individual needs (support for those struggling to reach the Expected Level and support the more able pupil who need extra challenge).

At school, we now have 6 classes and because of a burgeoning demand for places in the Early Years, we now have a straight reception class. This is a lovely class to work with.

Staffing

Staffing is the same as in the previous academic year. We have 7 teachers and 13 teaching assistants, 5 welfare staff, a cook and her assistant, 2 cleaners, a caretaker and a school bursar.

Road Safety Issues

PARKING ALONG SUMMERWOOD LANE & CARR MOSS LANE

Car parking either side of Summerwood Lane and Carr Moss Lane at school times and when funerals and weddings are taking place at St Cuthbert's Church are causing an obstruction and prevent large vehicles, including the emergency services from passing through.

Please use the Memorial Hall car park whenever possible.

PARKING ALONG MOSS ROAD AND ALL OUR NARROW LANES.

Can residents please park in their driveways if possible and leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow prams and wheelchairs to get through.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

There were two traffic accidents on 4th and 6th Sept in the village. The Council received complaints from local residents concerned about poor visibility at the cross roads of Morris Lane/Renacres Lane/Gorsuch Lane/A5174 where the junctions signs are, on occasion, obscured by overgrown vegetation. The Chair has written to our County Councillor O'Toole as Lancashire County Council is the Highways Authority asking him to escalate our concerns and provide a remedy.

A similar complaint was received about the difficulty of coming out of North Moor Lane, trying to turn right on to Gorsuch Lane, because of the blind bend and the height of the hedge on the right. Thanks from the Parish Council to whoever has lowered the hedge at the junction of North Moor Lane.

BISHOP'S WALK WALL

The Council was informed that a tractor with a trailer damaged the wall at Bishop's Walk at 8.45 am on 13th Sept. The Parish Clerk, Dave Bond, has informed Lancashire County Council, and the Chair has posted a notice in Halsall Village Community Forum to inform residents.

HEAVY LORRIES SERVICING THE KEW DEVELOPMENT

Complaints have been received by the Parish Council about heavy lorries using Moss Road, New Cut Lane, Heathey Lane and Renacres Lane to access the housing development, deviating from the agreed route. Many representations have been made over the years, by Halsall Parish Council, action groups and residents to Sefton Council and to the developers explaining the unsuitability of our roads and the fears of further damage to them.

TRAFFIC ROAD SAFETY WORKING GROUP

Your Council is forming a working group to tackle the many traffic safety issues which confront us. Any resident who might be able to contribute to finding solutions is welcome to contact the Parish Council and if desired to join the Working Group.

HALSALL WAR MEMORIAL & PLAYING FIELDS TRUST

The Trust is an independent self-funding charity and Halsall Parish Council, as a corporate body, is the sole Trustee.

The cricket fixtures have finished for 2022 and the football teams are starting their 2022/23 fixtures. Halsall FC play at 11:00 and Southport WFC play at 14:00, both on Sunday, so for home matches the car park will be busy.

Special thanks :-

- To the cricket teams' groundsmen for their superb grounds' maintenance throughout the year.
- To the cricket teams proposed initiative to collect rainwater from their storage hut to use for wicket watering in place of using the Hall's water.
- To the Snooker Players for their voluntary undertaking to replace the windows in the Snooker Hut
- To Dean Tiplady for voluntarily undertaking to resurface part of the car park on 24th Sept 2022, and to Eleanor Wroe from Halsall Proud and Tidy in helping to organise this.

Going forward:-

- The Trust is also investigating a rainwater harvesting system, collecting water from the Memorial Hall roof, to use for the Bakehouse's current and Trust's future flower displays
- The Trust is considering the installation of 'hedgehogs' in the guttering, to prevent debris falling from overhanging trees blocking gutters, overflowing and drenching Hall users and finding its way into water disposal systems.
- Howard and Cathy Smith, the Bakehouse proprietors, have stated to the Trust that they are more than happy to quote for catering for any bookings for functions in the Hall.

If you were standing in Halsall in 10,000 BC you could not see the coast because it stretched beyond the Isle of Man. Another 5000 years later after the ice age you would be scrambling to get up Clieves Hill because the sea would have been up to your neck. Ice is a heavy substance so when it melted the land rose and the new coast formed at Formby and Ainsdale.

Halsall was formed with an edge. To the west were sloppy marshes and sea channels, to the east scrub and bush; land dry enough for crops and animals.



Every child has heard of 1066 and for most adults it is the only bit of history that they remember. William The Conqueror gave rewards to his nobles after this date for winning the Battle at Hastings. Chetel, Villers and Poitou received parts of Heleshale (Halsall) which means 'a nook of land' They employed monks from the Fylde to show methods of draining the land. Soon a manor was established and the first Halsall was Allan de Lydiate. Allan had a penchant (they were French! It means liking) for the name Gilbert and there was a surfeit of Gilbert's up to the reign of Henry III in 1272 when Richard de Halsall held the manor. He called his son Gilbert. In 1346

another Gilbert made an agreement with Henry de Atherton to the marriage of his son Otes to Henry's sister Margaret and settled upon this son and his wife lands in Halsall and Barton. There was also liaison with the copycat Parrs of St Helens who curiously had the same coat of arms as the ancient arms of Halsall. Gifts came from Robert de Parr of land in Halsall and Downholland; also Birkdale and a place called Argarmeols, which was promptly swallowed by the sea and no longer exists, (bad gift).

These lands descended to Henry de Halsall, as son and heir of Sir Gilbert, son of Otes. Henry de Halsall, the heir, began an ecclesiastical career, and was in 1395 presented by his father to the rectory of Halsall, which in 1413 he exchanged for the archdeaconry of Chester. The building of the present parish church, in stone, started about 1290. Legend suggests the Lindisfarne monks brought the body of St Cuthbert this far south to escape Viking hordes in the 9th century. The church was originally in wood but was replaced in stone and took some time to build. It had been badly affected by the Black Death in 1349 when building stopped for 60 years.

Next in line Richard, married Grace daughter of Sir John Tempest in 1448. His son Hugh was lord of Halsall in 1483 and his son Henry, was made a knight by the weirdly named Lord Strange (a Stanley) in the border wars in Scotland in the autumn of 1497.

The Stanleys were the big cheeses because they were the 'kingmakers' of Henry VII at the Battle of Bosworth which started the Tudor dynasty. Henry Halsall married Margaret Stanley, daughter of James Stanley and it is this Sir Henry, who has the tomb in the parish church with his wife Margaret. On the opposite side is his brother Richard who was tonsured. A tonsure means a bald patch in the middle of the head neatly shaved to show that you were a monk. Sir Henry died in June 1522 but Richard the Rector lived until 1567.

Of Henry's sons, Thomas the eldest succeeded him; he was knighted in 1533 at the coronation of Anne Boleyn (another Halsall currying favour from a Tudor monarch this time Henry VIII.) His wife was Jane Stanley, daughter and co heir of John Stanley. A settlement was made of this great estate in the spring of 1572, to Edward Halsall, bastard son of Sir Henry Halsall, for life and to Cuthbert Halsall, bastard son of Richard, and his lawful male issue. In those days the word 'bastard' merely meant illegitimate or born out of marriage and was therefore a term of endearment.

Edward Halsall built the Grammar school attached to the church. This is now a choir vestry. He was a talented man who held various jobs. He was treated with suspicion because he stayed very close to Catholicism and did not order Protestant bibles for the school. After Edward's death Cuthbert Halsall succeeded. He was made a knight in 1599 and Sheriff of Lancaster in 1601 and 1612. He remained loyal to Catholicism and became known as 'Bad Sir Cuthbert' but not because of his religious leanings. He earned his notoriety through brawling with villagers and having a whore, just two of the lawsuits brought against him. He was also a gambler and gambled away his inheritance over 30 years and in 1631 ended up in debtor's prison. Halsall was sold in 1625 to the nearest bidder and that was the Blundells of Ince. The advowson which was the patronage of the church and church lands, was sold to Sir Charles Gerard, grandson of Sir Gilbert, who was Master of the Rolls in Queen Elizabeth's time and called by Elizabeth her 'golden ass' because he was so rich.

Apart from the tombs of the Halsalls in the chancel of the church the only other lasting reminder we have of the Halsalls is a fragment of brass on the wall in the chancel. It was dedicated to another Henry Halsall and probably adorned his tombstone in 1589. The surname Halsall has been numerous and widespread throughout the centuries, not direct descendants of the manorial family but having the name because of association with the village.



Gardener's Corner

October at-a-glance

One big benefit of autumn is that it is the start of a brand new season with a pattern all of its own. We have the rich tapestry of autumn colours and late flowers to look forward to - low orange colour of an Indian summer and refreshing evenings with a nip in the air. Happy gardening.

General garden tasks.

Tidy borders lightly, clear weeds & cut down flower stems.

Compost all green rubbish

Make a new lawn by laying turf

Reduce mowing

Carry out autumn lawn care

Plant container grown trees & shrubs, climbers & roses

Plant bare-root plants at the end of the month, providing the ground is ready

Check tree ties in windy weather

Prune late flowering climbing roses & repeat –flowering old-fashioned roses

Take hardwood cuttings of roses towards the end of the month

Pot up cuttings taken in the summer

Trim privet hedges

Remove fallen leaves from the crowns of plants to prevent rotting

Lift tender perennials & bulbs

Once the veg patch is cleared, carry out winter digging

Cut down asparagus foliage

Plant spring cabbage & over wintering onion sets

Plant garlic towards the end of the month or next month

Pot up herbs for winter use

Pick apples & pears for storing mid-month

Prepare for new fruit trees & plant if conditions allow

Have a good clear out of the greenhouse & prepare for the cold weather

Reduce the amount of water given to greenhouse plants as the nights get colder

Have a pond clear out: cut down any dead & decaying leaves.

Watch out for

First frosts

Plants in their prime

Japanese maples. Acers. Euonymus. Prycanthea. Malus. Colchicum. Nerine. Amaryllis. Perovskia. Chanomeles. Viburnum. Clematis varieties. Asters. Chrysanthemums. Kniphofia. Lavatera. Liriope. Penstemon. Sedum. Solidago. Tricytis. Cosmos. Nicotiana. Salvia. Winter flowering pansies. Persicaria. Heleniums. Rudbeckias.
