

EVERYONE IS WELCOME

Our Gift afternoon allows everyone in our Parish Community to make a financial gift towards the upkeep of the church. Our church is severely financially challenged and all gifts, no matter how small, would be very welcome.

The Earl of Macclesfield Halsall's most famous/infamous patron



Charles Gerard was Halsall church's patron. Born in 1618, he was the eldest son of Sir Charles Gerard, who built a windmill and watermill in Halsall. His great-grandfather was Sir Gilbert Gerard, one of the richest judges and close associate of Elizabeth I.

He financed a troop of horse in the English civil war, where he fought against Cromwell on the side of the future Charles II and was created Earl of Macclesfield.

Gerard was at the scene of several battles in the war, including Edgehill, Newbury in 1643 and Newark in the following year where he was wounded and taken prisoner. After the fall of Oxford to the Roundheads he left England with Prince Rupert and went to the Low Countries. In the spring of 1660 Gerard went to Breda, where the king held court and in May returned with the King to England after the fall of the Puritan government. He rode at the head in the King's progress to Whitehall on 29 May 1660. He was now a Baron and took the name Brandon.

With the sweeping away of Cromwell's Commonwealth and the restoration of the King Charles II, he became patron of Halsall church. This was a joint patronage with the Bishop of Chester but on the death of Matthew Smallwood the Rector, Gerard was by then Earl of Macclesfield and had exclusive patronage, to appoint Nathaniel Brownwell, rector in 1684,

He became involved in a dispute over Gawsworth estate in Cheshire, of which his cousin Alex Fitton was in possession, but which Gerard claimed. The case became acrimonious and Fitton was imprisoned for 20 years for libelling a peer. On 23 July 1679, he was created Earl of Macclesfield. He conspired with the Duke of Monmouth and the Earl of Shaftesbury against the Duke of York James, heir to the throne because

he was a Catholic. He was therefore in treason against Charles II and he was outlawed for this and fled abroad.

In 1688 he once again rode ahead of the King's progress this time being that of William III who usurped James II in what has been called the Glorious Revolution. His outlawry was reversed and he became a member of the Privy Council. Six years later he was dead and was buried on 7 January 1694 in Westminster Abbey. Samuel Pepys described him as a proud and violent man and a cheat.

The title and his estates passed to his son and heir Charles who died without issue. Two sisters were co-heirs of the properties: and their daughters married men who became involved in dispute over the Gawsworth and Halsall estates. Lord Mohun by the will of the second Lord Macclesfield, became owner of his wife's share of the Gerard estates, and there was a duel between him and the Duke of Hamilton with swords, in which both were killed. It was through Charlotte the widow of Lord Mohun that Halsall eventually passed down to Charles Mordaunt who built Halsall Hall.



NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

Planning

2022/1018/FUL - 15 Elm Park Drive - Conversion of existing garage and utility room into ground floor en-suite bedroom.

2022/1026/FUL - Primrose Hill Farm, Asmall Lane - Single storey extension to side and rear including internal and external alterations to elevations including larger windows to front and change to frame colour. 2022/1058/FUL - 115 Moss Road - New Dormer to Front

Report from Halsall Parish Council Traffic & Road Safety Working Group (extract — full version on website)

7th November 2022 HPC Working Group organised a public meeting with Andy Pratt, Deputy PCC to discuss road safety in Halsall. The meeting was very well attended by over 30 members of the public, with very emotive comments, and concerns about the lack of enforcement.

Andy reported back the same day to organise a follow-up meeting in December where he will come with LCC Highways and Police representatives to meet the Working Group.

Lancashire County Council's preliminary response to September's collision at Four Lane Ends (Morris Lane, Halsall Road, Renacres Lane and Gorsuch Lane) is that the road signs were improved in 2016; there is no evidence of speeding; road markings could be refreshed, and signs might need improving. More rumble strips or high friction road surface was suggested several times as it is believed many people miss the junction especially at night, or in bad weather.

Evidence suggests that the 2016 improvement to road signs has had no impact on the frequency of injury collisions; 10 collisions in 5 years before, at least 10 in 5 years since. There is no public data for 2022 yet.

James Rimmer organized a report and a petition for Andy from residents of New Cut Lane who want a chicane traffic calming measure. Cars take too long to slow down from 60 mph when they get to the 30 mph limit. James has agreed to join the HPC Working Group.

Mark Brown, spoke about speeding on New Street and the LCC speed detector, is still broken after 4 years. Observations of the 2 LCC speed detectors at Four Lane Ends suggest they might not be working.

A Moss Road resident spoke about being threatened by lorry drivers for taking photos of HGV lorries ignoring 7.5 ton weight limit on Moss Road.

Other issues raised included.

Is the post box at Four Lane Ends safe as it is on a junction? Flooding at this junction makes some drivers cross the white lines. Could trees on farmland, be cut back to improve the visibility? Reports of suspicious activity on Northmoor Lane Canal car park. Cars arriving and leaving within a few minutes, suspect drug dealing.

Cllr Ray Brookfield is continuing with his investigation on the availability of land for a village car park for school and church users.

Remembrance Day 13th November 2022

A Remembrance Day Service was conducted at St Cuthbert's Church in our Village by a visiting Church Reader. A gospel reading and a Wilfred Owen poem were read by Cllrs Young and Ridley. The congregation moved outside to continue the Service. At 11am, the last post was sounded, the names of the fallen in WWI and WWII were read out and wreaths were laid around the Monument, including one laid by a Falklands War Veteran.

The Congregation then followed the Cross down Halsall Road to the War Memorial Gates where the Church Reader finished the Service and wreaths were laid at the gates, under the flag which Cllr Timon had lowered to half- mast.

After the Service, the Congregation moved over to the Memorial Hall, where a team of volunteers had prepared a welcome buffet for everyone. It was well attended and many people expressed their appreciation of the volunteers' work, the friendly community atmosphere and the lovely food provided. It was great to see our local PCSOs attending the event. Halsall Parish Council would like to thank the Church for the moving Service, all the volunteers for their selfless work and the Parish Clerk for the administrative work of official road closure around the Cross and commissioning the traffic management company.





Gardener's Corner

December & January at-a-glance

The garden is magical in winter. The colour palette is limited, but the strong shapes & skeletal framework provide its own kind of beauty & don't forget the garden can be a great source of home-grown material for a natural feel to Christmas decorations in & outside the home. Happy Christmas & Happy Gardening.

General garden tasks

Continue winter digging if soil is workable.

Plan & begin any landscaping jobs.

Clear away any debris to prevent harbouring slugs

& snails.

Rake up the last of the leaves.

Send off for seed catalogues to browse through on darker rainy days.

Carry out lawn repairs if weather conditions allow.

Move or plant deciduous trees or shrubs if the soil is workable.

Prune ornamental vines.

Cut shoots for indoor decorations.

Organise your Christmas tree.

Sow seeds of hardy plants.

Plant seasonal outdoor tubs & hanging baskets for Christmas.

Plant fruit trees & bushes.

Continue to check stored fruit.

Tidy plants in the greenhouse & continue to water sparingly.

Check any bulbs in store.

Check tubs planted with bulbs for mice disturbance.

Make provisions to prevent pond from freezing over.

Clear up the shed, clean tools, wash pots & trays – spring will be here before you know!

Watch out for

Chilled pot plants – pot plants that have been standing in the open outside shops may have come straight from a warm & sheltered greenhouse. Poinsettias are especially vulnerable.

Prunus `Autumnalis`. Viburnum. Mahonia. Japonica. Cotoneaster. Fatsia. Malus. Photinia. Pyracantha. Skimmia. Clematis `freckles`. Jasmine varieties. Winter flowering pansies.
