

Archbishop William Thomas Porter CBE. 1887-1960

"he who listens to my word and believes in the one who sent me has life in him"

Halsall was the birthplace of an Archbishop.

William was born in a house known as the Lychgate in Renacres Lane to Henry and Ellen Porter. He had two brothers and the family were practising Anglicans. It was in that familial setting that he first heard "the Word of Life." They went to church in a Methodist chapel called the Matchbox church on Small Lane North. It was destroyed in a fire but rebuilt on another site on the lane. His father, William died in 1893 and



was buried in St Cuthbert's but because many of the family were members of the free church they would not enter the parish church and only attended at the graveside.

His mother Ellen, who had been raised in New Cut Farm, had to walk into Ormskirk and work long hours at the workhouse to feed her family of three boys, so to help the situation William found work as a messenger boy for a local tailor. He then worked locally on the farms which entailed going to Liverpool market very early, before 3 am by cart. Once at the market carters would often have to walk rather than ride to stop them falling asleep. When their carts were empty of produce, they filled up with night soil and brought that back as fertiliser for the fields.

After his mother's death in 1900 of Tuberculosis at the age of 35, William was fostered to his uncle's house in Bickerstaffe where he met a relative, Aggie, the first Catholic he had ever known. She was a favourite of the family and left an impression on him. He then went to work for the Massams who had the Hen and Chickens pub in Melling, they were very kind to him. From there he went to work for the Westons at Twist farm in Ford, a devout Catholic family. His knowledge of Catholics up until then had been formed by prejudice and sectarian attitudes but within this family his prejudice died. After hearing a firebrand preacher denouncing Cardinal Newman he decided to find out about Catholicism for himself.

He took Catechetical instruction at St Thomas's in Waterloo in 1910 and studied to gain entry into Apostolic college. He achieved this and entered a seminary in Ireland. When he sailed into Cork harbour he described it as sailing into heaven.

He was attracted to working for the foreign missions in Africa in a personal vocation to redress the harm done by slavery, so after his ordination as a priest on 14th July 1918 he joined the Society of African Missions. He initially started his work in Nigeria and began to make a difference and an impression. In 1937 while on missionary work, he was called back to Halsall when his elder brother Henry died and was buried in Halsall churchyard. He worked tirelessly in Ghana, creating schools and hospitals, inspired by the teaching of 'Word of Life'

It was his calm and positive nature when faced with problems of famine and disease which underpinned his work in Africa and eventually led to him being consecrated as Archbishop of Cape coast in Ghana. Altogether he dedicated a total of 50 years to missionary work. Archbishop William retired in 1960 and died in 1966 he was buried in the grounds of the retirement home at Dutton Manor but his body had to be reinterred in Wardley 2013 when the land was redeveloped.

Gardener`s Corner

May at-a-glance

May is, for me, one of the most exciting & loveliest months of the year in the garden, because you can see new flowers opening every time you step outdoors & the best of the year is still to come. Longer evenings and warmer weather brings out the gardener in all of us.

General Garden Tasks

Prepare the soil for bedding plants.

Keep on top of weeding & hoeing - its endless I know!

Deal with pests using biological controls & organic remedies.

Feed established lawns if not done in April.

Pinch out any green shoots appearing on variegated trees & shrubs.

Tie in new growth of climbers & wall shrubs.

Clip beech, hornbeam, box & Leyland cypress late this month or early next. Cut privet.

Support perennials.

Divide clumps of primroses & polyanthus after flowering.

Continue deadheading & feeding spring-flowering bulbs.

Plant & train sweet peas. Plant tubs, troughs, window boxes & hanging baskets in the middle of this month at the earliest.

Sow swede, beetroot, maincrop carrots, peas, raddish & spring onion.

Direct-sow frost-tender vegetables, e.g. French & runner beans, courgettes. Plant out leeks.

Harvest overwintered onions.

Water soft fruit bushes with swelling fruit & newly planted fruit trees.

Protect strawberries from birds.

Continue to prick out seedlings, young plants & cuttings.

Continue hardening off bedding plants ready for end of month planting.

Plant tomatoes in early may & sweet peppers, chillies, melons & cucumbers late May.

Harvest baby potatoes.

Divide overgrown waterlilies in the pond.

Introduce new fish to the water garden now the weather is warmer.

Watch out for

Late frosts – protect with fleece. Pests in the greenhouse & containers.

Plants in their Prime

Rhododendrons. Clematis 'Nelly Moser'. Clematis Montana. Viburnum. Dianthus. Wisteria. Euphorbia. Geum. Lonicera. Corydalis. Rosa 'Lutea'. Tree peonies. Chaenomeles. Cotoneaster. Kerria japonica. Potentilla. Sambuscus Nigra. Spiraea. Caellia.
