

The Rector Writes



I wonder what you think about when you hear the word "pilgrimage?" perhaps it is of one of the famous pilgrim routes like the Camino in Spain or one of the many pilgrim routes in this country to sites such as Canterbury, Durham, or Lindisfarne. But a pilgrimage does not have to be a long walk to a famous holy site. In reality a pilgrimage is simply about making a journey and intentionally seeking to slow down and be with God. You don't even need to leave the comfort of your armchair, although physically getting out and walking even if it is only around the garden helps the body as well as the mind & spirit engage in the process.

In intentionally entering into the spirit of being a pilgrim we reconnect with the deep wells of faith that have inspired people down the ages. As we take a breath and a step, we reconnect with our spirits, and can be inspired by the ancient wisdom of our countryside and the men and women who have inhabited and moulded it for centuries.

The metaphor of a journey is relevant to us all. We are all trying to find our way in an increasingly complex world. How do we address the challenges of living with the multiple effects of the COVID-19 pandemic? How do we navigate the ever-changing landscape arising from the rapid development of artificial intelligence, or make sense of the changes in society's norms and values?

Like many pilgrims before us it is right, we lament what we may well have lost, whilst also giving thanks for all that has blessed and continues to bless us. By pulling on our metaphorical boots and walking slowly and deliberately, whether actually or in our spirits, let the process refresh weary bones. Let the process of slowing down open you up to new ways to pray, to think about scripture and to engage with the big questions of our faith. We also learn new ways to be with each other and ways to tread lightly on this beautiful place in which we live.





Report from Traffic & Road Safety Group

There were a number of traffic related items this month. Lancashire County Council has finished the plans for Four Lane Ends junction. There will be new illuminated signs, high-vis signs and new road markings, hopefully within the next 3 months.

Mark Brown has been conducting a one-man campaign to get the solar powered speed sign on New Street repaired, for most of its life it has been faulty. LCC have agreed to replace it in July.

There was a collision at Plex Moss Lane crossroads. A week earlier, LCC rejected a request for a safety mirror because there were no accidents at this junction. The Parish Council will try again with an offer to pay for the mirror.

There was a fail-to-stop collision on Carr Moss Lane when a parked car was damaged overnight and a serious collision on Heathey Lane when overtaking parked cars, excessive speed was main factor.

Please park on your drives if have one. If you have to park on the road then consider partially parking on the pavement. Only if it is wide enough not to obstruct pedestrians/prams and not force them into the road. Ensure the road is wide enough for agricultural and emergency vehicles to pass.

Most of the lanes in Halsall are narrow. Please take extra care to park considerately for your safety and for safety of other road users.

The Council agreed a grant of £330 to support the cost of printing the parish magazine for the year ending 2022/223.

Drainage Ditches

Complaints have been received from Farmers about residents dumping garden refuse into adjacent ditches. There is an extensive network of interconnected ditches all around Halsall that are pumped out into the River Ribble at Banks. Without this active pumping the low land around Halsall would flood. Please do not obstruct the ditches, do not let debris flow downstream to get blocked elsewhere.

Bell Ringing

Hi, my name is Josh Howard and one of my hobbies is bell ringing. I am 11 years old and I have been ringing the church bells for 1 ½ years.

I first started ringing the bells when I was asked by a lady at St. Michael's church in Aughton. It's fun to do and it can make you stronger - especially in the arms! I have also made new friends as there are about ten bell ringers at St. Michael's (only six can ring at any one time though). I then volunteered to ring the bells at St. Cuthbert's church, Halsall because there were no bell ringers.



I have rung at St. Cuthbert's at Harvest Festival and for Mother's Day. Recently, I have been asked to ring for my first wedding - this will be at St. Cuthbert's. I also rang for the King's Coronation at both St. Michael's and St. Cuthbert's and received a certificate from 'The Ringing World' as a thank you. I was presented with it during the church service at St. Michael's.

In the school holidays I went to Liverpool with my family and we visited the Anglican Cathedral where we saw the massive bell, Great George. It weighs 15 tonnes, has a diameter of 2.9m and is bigger than Big Ben! Great George is the second largest bell in the UK. The other 13 bells that surround Great George weigh 17 tonnes - it is these bells that are rung every Sunday. Great George is only rung for special occasions like Christmas. (Great Paul of St. Paul's Cathedral in London is the largest bell in the UK.)

I attend bell ringing practice at St. Michael's, Aughton every Monday at 7.30pm-9.00 pm. If anyone is interested in joining the bell ringing team, please come along on this practice night.



Gardener's Corner

July & August at-a-glance

July is peak flowering time for most gardens, while August is the culmination of months of effort. The garden is a paint box of summer colour, herbaceous borders zing with colour, bedding plants are blooming fit to bust & hanging baskets are full to the brim & in full swing.

And if you fancy a change of scene, it's a great time to go garden visiting.

Summer is here - enjoy. Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Raise the cutting height of the lawn mower blades during hot dry spells.

Avoid watering the lawn, except a new lawn in long dry spells.

Prune & deadhead roses.

Prune philadelphus & wisteria.

Clip privet & other fast-growing hedges.

Continue taking softwood cuttings of shrubs.

Cut lavender for drying.

Keep on top of deadheading plants & perennials.

Divide old clumps of bearded irises & replant.

Plant autumn flowering bulbs.

Sow maincrop carrots, peas, turnips, lettuce, radishes & spring cabbages.

`Stop` outdoor tomatoes.

Cut & dry or freeze herbs.

Tidy strawberry beds & grow spare plants from runners.

Harvest raspberries, redcurrants, blackcurrants & gooseberries.

Train a standard fuchsia.

Water & feed greenhouse plants more often now the weather is hotter & the containers are filling up with roots.

Provide more oxygen in ponds if necessary by thinning waterweeds or running a fountain.

Divide water iris.

Watch out for

Cabbage white butterflies laying eggs on brassica plants.

Potato blight on potatoes & tomatoes.


