

The Rector Writes



We like counting things. Often, we feel reassured when we can see a number that we can work with. Numbers are everywhere. Often worldly success is seen in terms of numbers. Numbers inform us and can help us plan.

The bible too likes to count people and things. Think of Jesus feeding the five thousand in Luke chapter 9, or the ten lepers Jesus healed, recorded in Luke chapter 17. In Acts chapter 2, after Peter's speech to a crowd of onlookers gathered in Jerusalem, around three thousand people decided to follow Jesus and his teaching.

The Church of England likes to count things too. In October we have the national count of all people attending church, both on Sundays and during the week. Many of you will have seen the year-on-year headlines about the decline in numbers attending church on both a regular and irregular basis, which are derived from this annual count. Is that the whole story? Is the Church of England in terminal decline? What is the story behind those numbers?

The reality is that numbers can be a helpful tool, but they also mask much deeper meanings. They overlook the individual stories of pain and triumph. Sometimes they feel so frightening they stop us from taking action.

Whilst the bible records many numbers, God is not so much interested in the numbers themselves, but rather in how we, as stewards of this world, make sure everyone and everything counted really matters. As people of faith, we are called to look deeper to see and hear the stories behind those numbers, both wonderful and tragic. God calls every one of us to play our part in ensuring that each person we encounter knows that they count are not merely counted.

position is left wing.

I have been to watch loads of games at Anfield Stadium with my family and even had a tour there.

<u>Further reflections on Reverend Canon W H Bullough</u> <u>Rector of St Cuthbert's Church 1959 -1991</u>

Some people still living in Halsall, can remember starting school shortly before Canon Bullough arrived to take up his post as Rector. In the 1950s, children stayed at the village school until they were fourteen years of age but during the 1960s that changed and pupils aged eleven started to go to secondary school in Ormskirk. Canon Bullough was frequently in school, leading collective worship and teaching religious education. His passion for education was reflected in the fact that he was on the Liverpool Diocesan Board of Education for many years. He was a firm believer that church and school should be closely connected and frequently involved large numbers of children in lavish productions in church. Several people, who went on to have public speaking roles in their working lives, have Canon Bullough to thank as he would never accept anything less than loud, clear confident speaking, which he made certain of by standing under the bell tower to make sure everyone in the rear pews could hear!


Sarah remembers the fund raising events on the rectory lawns which included a variety of stalls and games including a bowling competition. She also recalls Canon Bullough heaping praise upon her during Church Parade when he presented her with the Baden Powell Trefoil Award, as she was the first guide in Halsall to receive the award. During confirmation classes, the children received reminder postcards and Sarah remembers the handwritten message on hers, asking her to carry up the oblations with her Mum and her sister.

Canon Bullough served the parish and parishioners of St Cuthbert's for the largest part of his priesthood. He was a dedicated man who thought being a parish priest was a more important mission than seeking advancement in his career. He was a man of high standards who gave inspirational and thought provoking sermons. Often these would seek to show how relevant the teachings of the Bible are to modern life. Along with his wife Joan, he started many fund raising events including Mothering Sunday coffee mornings, rectory open days and church tours to name but a few. Those who have been in the parish for a while will probably remember " buy a brick for two and six "to fund the building of the new school hall.

On his retirement his legacy was a thriving parish, and a well maintained church with a large congregation. He was sorely missed by many.

Gardener`s Corner

October at-a-glance

One big benefit of autumn is that it is the start of a brand new season with a pattern all of its own. We have the rich tapestry of autumn colours and late flowers to look forward to - low orange colour of an Indian summer and refreshing evenings with a nip in the air. Happy gardening.

General garden tasks.

Tidy borders lightly, clear weeds & cut down flower stems. Compost all green rubbish Make a new lawn by laying turf Reduce mowing Carry out autumn lawn care Plant container grown trees & shrubs, climbers & roses Plant bare-root plants at the end of the month, providing the ground is ready Check tree ties in windy weather Prune late flowering climbing roses & repeat –flowering old-fashioned roses Take hardwood cuttings of roses towards the end of the month Pot up cuttings taken in the summer Trim privet hedges Remove fallen leaves from the crowns of plants to prevent rotting Lift tender perennials & bulbs Once the veg patch is cleared, carry out winter digging Cut down asparagus foliage Plant spring cabbage & over wintering onion sets Plant garlic towards the end of the month or next month Pot up herbs for winter use Pick apples & pears for storing mid-month Prepare for new fruit trees & plant if conditions allow Have a good clear out of the greenhouse & prepare for the cold weather Reduce the amount of water given to greenhouse plants as the nights get colder

Have a pond clear out: cut down any dead & decaying leaves.

First frosts

Plants in their prime

Japanese maples. Acers. Euonymus. Prycanthea. Malus. Colchicum. Nerine. Amaryllis. Perovskia. Chanomeles. Viburnum. Clematis varieties. Asters. Chrysanthemums. Kniphofia. Lavatera. Liriope. Penstemon. Sedum. Solidago. Tricytis. Cosmos. Nicotiana. Salvia. Winter flowering pansies. Persicaria. Heleniums. Rudbeckias.
