November is one of those months that stirs strange emotions. The leaves are falling or have fallen. The nights are closing in and the weather is often cold and damp. As Keats would put it is the season of "mists and mellow fruitfulness". A season where nature takes on a different hue and without the leaves on the trees we can see further.

It is the month in which we remember and give thanks for those have died in conflicts around the world and remember those who continue to be affected by the trauma of war; the bereaved and those left with life changing injuries both physical and emotional. With the ongoing conflicts in Ukraine and in Israel it can be hard not to feel overwhelmed with a sense of hopelessness.

It is important to remember and lament the dreadful cost of war for in doing so we retell their stories as well as ours. We are called to ponder how we have been and continue to be changed by the acts of courage and resilience of so many individuals.

At the going down of the Sun, We will remember them!



The remains of six men lie at peace in St Cuthbert's churchvard. Four from World War I and two from World War II. The rest are buried close to the battlefields where they fell. The ultimate sacrifice was to lay down your life for your comrades and country, however, a significant sacrifice was also paid by men and women who survived the wars but whose lives were altered as a consequence, either as enlisted soldiers or as loved ones, who remained at home with the worry. Many of these were women who worked the fields and factories at home making their own war effort.

In the 'The Great War' communication with the front line of battle was poor. Some men went through the hell and would not speak of their experience after, others suffered life changing injuries. Not all paid the ultimate price of death and the action of many men and women who served has faded. William Witter, a local man, started work on a transport ship but changed to the infantry and was wounded badly in April 1917. Robert Parkin of Plex Lane was withdrawn to a London hospital after service with the Kings Liverpool Regiment in 1915. Thomas W Jump was captured and kept as a prisoner of war. J G Baxter, the station master was shot in the mouth, the bullet lodged near his spine incapacitating him. Fred Edwards of New Street was reported missing in the Ormskirk Advertiser on the 2nd May 1918. Sapper Gradwell son of a former Churchwarden suffered a shrappel wound to the jaw 25th October 1917.

Most of the men and women who died in both World Wars are on the monument outside the church and on the Kohima gates. Some men with Halsall connections were included on monuments of neighbouring villages. Richard Rimmer a farmworker from Plex Lane, the grandson of Richard and Mary Winstanley of Barton, died on 8th August 1916. He was 21 and was living in Station Road which was then called Barton Lane, with his grandparents when war broke out. William Slater and his brother George died in the same week in November 1916. Their names are on the memorial in Liverpool but are also commemorated on a gravestone near the entrance to Halsall church.

There are discrepancies on the monuments and some men are not listed and this happened more on First World War monuments. The original role of honour of those men killed in action in WWI was made on parchment. It hangs on the wall of the church and only includes 19 names. The stone memorial outside the church has 23 names and in 2010 a further 11 names were included on a separate tablet.

The local church played an important part in honouring the dead. It included on the memorial men and women within the Ecclesiastical parish not just the civil parish. At the outbreak of war in 1914. Haskayne and Downholland had few houses and farms and were in the Ecclesiastical (Church) parish of Halsall. It was only in 2012 that the north part of Haskayne was included in the parish of St Thomas while Barton has always remained in Halsall parish. A blurring of the boundaries occurred and therefore, several soldiers who are included on Lydiate's war memorial were from Halsall parish.

Numerous young men, mainly farmer's sons who had avoided being sent to war because they were deemed vital to agriculture and food production felt compelled to enlist when the war went into a third and fourth year and more soldiers were needed. Conscription was extended in 1915 to include men up to 51 years of age and they joined the fray. The census of 1911 reveals the names of young men and older men who became eligible to fight as the War progressed. Did they go? Maybe they did or maybe some were caught up in the second conflict which began in 1939.

During the Second World War communications were much improved and records were more reliable. The role of honour in the church for the second great conflict contains many more names because it includes civilian casualties and all those who served in the forces, not just the deceased.



Report from Traffic & Road Safety Group

Lancashire County Council have clarified that new street lighting on Birkdale Cop will lead to a change to a 30mph zone when the house building work has been completed.

A water leak at the junction of Renacres Lane and New Cut has been repaired. LCC will be asked for a more thorough repair to the road surface rather than just the area around the manhole,

Please park on your drives if have one. If you have to park on the road then consider partially parking on the pavement. Only if it is wide enough not to obstruct pedestrians/prams and not force them into the road. Ensure the road is wide enough for agricultural and emergency vehicles to pass.

Most of the lanes in Halsall are narrow. Please take extra care to park considerately for your safety and for safety of other road users.

HALSALL WAR MEMORIAL PLAYING FIELD AND HALL TRUST


Halsall Parish Council is sole Trustee of the Memorial Hall which is a self-funding charity, no 521111 regulated by the Charity Commission.

We hire our facilities to annual users such as the Cricket team, Football teams, the Snooker Club and the Scouts for storage facilities. We hire to various weekly users such as Dog Training and Dance groups, as well as for ad hoc functions like children's parties. We have two new hirers, a children's football matches on a Saturday mornings and a monthly coffee morning, the next one being on 16th November from 11am to 1pm.

Further reflections on Reverend Canon W H Bullough Rector of St Cuthbert's Church 1959 -1991

Some people still living in Halsall, can remember starting school shortly before Canon Bullough arrived to take up his post as Rector. In the 1950s, children stayed at the village school until they were fourteen years of age but during the 1960s that changed and pupils aged eleven started to go to secondary school in Ormskirk. Canon Bullough was frequently in school, leading collective worship and teaching religious education. His passion for education was reflected in the fact that he was on the Liverpool Diocesan Board of Education for many years. He was a firm believer that church and school should be closely connected and frequently involved large numbers of children in lavish productions in church. Several people, who went on to have public speaking roles in their working lives, have Canon Bullough to thank as he would never accept anything less than loud, clear confident speaking, which he made certain of by standing under the bell tower to make sure everyone in the rear pews could hear!

Sarah remembers the fund raising events on the rectory lawns which included a variety of stalls and games including a bowling competition. She also recalls Canon Bullough heaping praise upon her during Church Parade when he presented her with the Baden Powell Trefoil Award, as she was the first guide in Halsall to receive the award. During confirmation classes, the children received reminder postcards and Sarah remembers the handwritten message on hers, asking her to carry up the oblations with her Mum and her sister.

Canon Bullough served the parish and parishioners of St Cuthbert's for the largest part of his priesthood. He was a dedicated man who thought being a parish priest was a more important mission than seeking advancement in his career. He was a man of high standards who gave inspirational and thought provoking sermons. Often these would seek to show how relevant the teachings of the Bible are to modern life. Along with his wife Joan, he started many fund raising events including Mothering Sunday coffee mornings, rectory open days and church tours to name but a few. Those who have been in the parish for a while will probably remember "buy a brick for two and six "to fund the building of the new school hall. On his retirement his legacy was a thriving parish, and a well maintained church with a large congregation. He was sorely missed by many.



Gardener's Corner

November at-a-glance

Once the autumn leaves have fallen, evergreen shrubs really come into their own. They give the garden year-round backbone and some are very striking, in shades of gold, reds, bronze or blues, as well as plain green or various variegated patterns, late berries, craggy tree trunks and coloured stems of trees and shrubs – who said winter was dull. Happy gardening.

General garden tasks

Carry out winter digging of forking over.

Check over the garden for anything that's likely to be at risk from frost Continue cutting the grass if conditions allow, but raise the blades,

Collect up dead leaves from the lawn & make leaf mould & potting compost Lay turf if you didn't last month

Plant & move bare-root trees & shrubs

Stake well any newly planted trees

Sow seeds of hardy shrubs & trees

Plant tulips this month

Dig up dahlia tubers once the plants start to die off after the first frosts

Protect container plants from the cold, wet & windy weather

Continue harvesting leeks & Brussels sprouts.

Plant fruit trees

Ventilate the greenhouse on warm days but reduce watering

Check stored fruit & vegetables

Grow windowsill & salad herbs

Do your autumn pond clear-out if you didn't get round to it last month Clean pool filters & check cables for pumps & lights

Watch out for

Snails in crevices around the garden

Mice in sheds & greenhouses especially where there is stored fruit

Pigeons pinching your winter greens

Squirrels digging up your bulbs

Windy weather disturbing tree stakes chaffing the bark.

Get ahead

Think about any garden designing & alterations you'd like to do over the winter months

Give the lawn mower a maintenance check now or over the winter

Start winter pruning

Mulch fruit trees

Plants in their prime

Viburnum. Ornamental cabbages. Winter flowering pansies. Potted topiary. Gaultheria. Skimmia. Clematis `freckles`. Mahonia. Euonymus. Pyracantha. Winter jasmine.




