The Rector Writes

"Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil". Luke 4:1-2

The forty days and forty nights that Jesus spent in the wilderness are the blueprint for the season of Lent, and ever since then, Christians around the world have been challenged to think about how they mark the six weeks that directly precede Easter.

For many Lent is about deciding what to give up. The list is endless; chocolate, sugar, alcohol, coffee, mobile phones or tablets (by which I mean those hand-held computer devices) or swearing. Equally it might be about trying to be more disciplined in consciously slowing down for a short time each day or spending time reading the bible. Whatever we decide to do we need to do with our whole heart and with an expectation of being both challenged and surprised.

Pope Francis said, "Lent comes providentially to reawaken us, to shake us from our lethargy. Fasting makes sense if it really chips away at our security and, as a consequence, benefits someone else, if it helps us cultivate the style of the good Samaritan, who bent down to his brother in need and took care of him."

So how will you approach Lent in 2024? In addition to your own Lenten discipline, what about committing to learning about some of the challenges we face as communities? This year we are inviting a series of speakers to come and get us thinking around issues of social justice. Why not come along and bring a friend or a neighbour? (Details are given elsewhere in the newsletter).

Whatever you decide to do, may I encourage everyone to try something different this year. Who knows? Maybe this will be the start of something. And maybe an alternative approach will draw us all closer as a community and help us all to be even more thankful for all we have been given.

Growing a vision for St Cuthbert's Church

We are blessed with a beautiful medieval church that has inspired multiple generations. It is a place of prayer for the community and the wider world. We are here for the joy of baptisms and weddings and the pain and anguish of funerals. By simply being, we tell of our Christian heritage.

The church provides a space for the village to gather at key festivals, to mark the seasons and a place to ponder the big questions. It provides educational opportunities as well as support to the school. What would you like the church to do and be? Let the Rector know your ideas.

But let us also be honest St Cuthbert's is on a knife edge both structurally and financially. It is an amazing grade 1 listed building, but it is on the at risk register. The church needs a new roof, the west window needs to be secured, the heating system is on its last legs. The list is long and expensive.

Every Church of England Parish Church has to support itself and its ministry. Currently our expenditure exceeds our income by a considerable amount each month. We do not have hidden financial assets or reserves. We do not get help from the Diocese, the National Church, or the Church Commissioners. The church and the community it serves are responsible for its upkeep and the activities it runs.

We can fundraise and apply for grants but without people giving regularly to the church the long-term survival of the church remains profoundly uncertain.

What can you do to enable the church to be the beating heart of the community? Are you willing to help secure the church's future? If so, please consider giving whatever you can afford regularly either via the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) or by becoming a friend of St Cuthbert's.

Information about both schemes are on our website or in leaflets at the back of church. We need the whole community to work together if St Cuthbert's is not only going to survive but flourish.



Halsall Bees and Butterflies Brigade

Hello everyone! It's the start of an exciting year for "The Bs" and we have been making plans and preparing the way for planting to begin in March. Our main aim for the spring is to plant up the bank and ha-ha in St Cuthbert's Churchyard, near the Memorial Garden. We intend to add spreading plants on the bank to stabilize it, but the plants will be chosen carefully for their nectar-rich flowers and bright spring/summer colour. I have plants like aubretia and beach aster in mind.

A native wild-flower seed mix will follow, sown into the bottom of the ha-ha. This area used to be an old road and the soil is quite thin and stony – perfect for wildflowers, many of which prefer an infertile, free-draining soil. Look out for beautiful annuals appearing here first, flowers such as dancing, scarlet poppies and stunning, blue cornflowers. Perennial wild-flowers will take longer to establish themselves but, by next year, plants like ox-eye daisy, borage and red clover will appear and continue to come back year after year. It will be a feast for the bees and a feast for the eyes!

If you'd like to help with these projects and others like them, please do get in touch with me (email below); there is plenty to do and we are keen to get more of the local community involved. Whether you want to dig, barrow and let off steam or just simply plant a special plant or sow some seeds, your contribution to the group will be truly valuable.

We'll be meeting in St Cuthbert's Churchyard on Sunday 24th March from 2pm to start planting the bank.

If you'd like to catch us sooner, we're holding an afternoon tea with a "Gardening for Wildlife" theme in The Memorial Hall on Sunday 17th March 2-4pm. Come and meet us, have a chat and enjoy a drink and a piece of cake. We'd love to meet you!



Refurbishment of St Aidan's Hall

The hall upgrade and spruce up is still ongoing by volunteers and Councillors. The installation of wifi has been successfully completed. The increase in use is already significant. The fortnightly Luncheon Club, organised by the Shirdley Hill Community Association, under the Warm Spaces Initiative, is proving very popular. Details of regular upcoming social events are posted on the Shirdley Hill Hub Facebook page and all are welcome. A Quiz is being organised for Feb 2nd at 7pm at St Aidan's Hall.

Report from Traffic & Road Safety Group

The Council has received correspondence from concerned parents, villagers and motorists requesting a Pelican crossing across New Street. A kind benefactor has offered to pay for this installation as previous correspondence requesting LCC funding for this has been refused on the grounds that this is not an accident black-spot. The Council has asked County Councillor O'Toole to intervene.

The proposed road markings and signage improvements to Morris Lane / Renacres Lane junction have been partially implemented. Special thanks are due to Mark Brown too from OWL for his persistence about road issues in the village.

Parking

Please can residents please in their driveways if possible and leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow prams and wheelchairs to get through. The Council frequently receives complaints about parents parking inconsiderately during the school run to St Cuthbert's School. The Council has written to the School Governors

to request a meeting about the criteria for intake policy, as the Council has received complaints about some local children apparently being excluded, and others from far afield apparently being accepted.

Potholes and Flooding

The Love Clean Streets app available on phones or computers has vielded some success with pothole repairs and street flooding issues. Cllrs Timon and Schofield have been particularly active on this. It is open to anyone to use this, so please go ahead and report yourselves if you have identified a problem. A pothole at Gregory Lane was 'fixed' around 12th Dec 2023 but the area broke down again almost, immediately. It was 'fixed' again on or around 7th or 8th January 2024 and the quality of the repair has attracted much criticism. Freedom Information ,request is being sent to LCC to establish the costs of these 'repairs' and the Council will consider options going forward.

Restoration of Ancient public footpaths in Halsall

Halsall has a large number of public footpaths, some of which have become overgrown. Our Parish Clerk, Chris, and his friend have recently strimmed nettles/weeds along a couple of paths, repaired a wooden bridge, acting as kind volunteers, in response to requests from residents. More volunteers are needed as we have many more footpaths. Please contact Chris Pyne or Liz Wright if you are willing to volunteer to help as if we don't use these paths we may lose them. We have received a £500 Grant from LCC to spend on footpaths.



Gardener's Corner

February at-a-glance.

The first signs of spring are starting to appear if you don't mind going out to look for them! February is a subtle month with catkins and the first bulbs cautiously pushing their heads above the wintery earth, while keen gardeners desperately look for some real gardening to do. Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Make new beds and borders

Finish off winter digging

Order plug plants

Prune certain types of clematis – refer to a good gardening book for exact advice Renewal – prune old shrubs, deciduous hedges and climbers

Brush snow off conifers, large evergreens and hedges to avoid splaying or breaking Move deciduous trees and shrubs (ideally do this in November or early March)

Plant lily-of-the-valley crowns

Keep deadheading any winter flowering pansies or polyanthus in tubs and hanging baske

Water and top-dress plants in year-round tubs and container grown herbs

Prepare soil ready for sowing, covering it with polythene sheeting to warm it up for early vegetables

Plan shallots and Jerusalem artichokes.

Prune autumn-fruiting raspberries now, and plant new canes between now and mid-march

Protect strawberries with horticultural fleece

Finish winter-pruning standard apple and pear trees

Ventilate the greenhouse at every opportunity, but water as little as you can get away with

Pot up stored dahlia tubers and lily bulbs

Spray fuchsias with water on fine days o start them back into growth

Chit potatoes if you didn't get chance last month

Take precautions to make sure your pond never freezes over entirely

Get-a-head

Prepare the greenhouse before the season gets fully underway -clean water storage barrels, watering cans, pots and seed trays, propagator and greenhouse glass.


