

Here we are again at that beautiful time of year, when we can sense new life emerging and the longer, warmer days encourage us to look up and out. It's that time of year when we are faced with mountains of Easter eggs, Easter bunnies and Easter chicks everywhere we look.

In contrast to the hope of another Spring, the war in Ukraine rumbles on and tensions in Israel and Palestine continue. People around the world continue to be displaced by war, famine, and natural disaster. When there are Individuals struggling with the cost of living and finding their place in the world and we cannot find sustainable ways to care for our fragile planet, the message of Easter is more important and more profound than ever. For it is a message of hope in the face of overwhelming adversity.

The Bees and Butterflies Brigade

Hello everyone,

As I write, the beautiful droplet-heads of snowdrops are opening in my garden, in Bishop's Walk and in other woodland areas across the village. They are such a delight at this time of year and help to raise the spirits when the winter seems long. Bees emerging from hibernation need snowdrops as much as we do – they are glad of a source of nectar and pollen in late winter, when other food sources are limited.

If you have snowdrops in your garden you can easily increase their numbers by dividing up the clumps. Wait until the flowers have faded but the leaves are still strong and green. Dig up a clump carefully using a trowel or small spade, making sure you lift the leaves and bulbs together. Separate the clump into smaller groups with your fingers and then you can replant each of these smaller clumps in their new position, spreading them through your garden. Snowdrops love a semi-shaded spot so avoid planting them where they will get too hot or dry out. This process is called planting snowdrops "in the green" and it is generally thought that this is the best way to get snowdrop bulbs to establish. If you do this, your bulbs will increase naturally with time, give you lots of pleasure and help the bees in winters to come. Happy planting!

At the end of January I was lucky enough to attend a meeting about Lancashire's "Local Nature Recovery Strategy". Lots of knowledgeable and enthusiastic people came together to generate ideas on the best ways to help nature in our county. The Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust were there, as well as representatives from The Canal and River Trust, local organic farmers and people like me from community groups across Lancashire. It was amazing to meet so many people who care about our wildlife and who want to help reverse the devastating decline in biodiversity of the last 50 years. I really hope that, as a result of people coming together like this, we will see positive change in our countryside and communities that will favour nature. It is not too late – not yet.

So if you care about nature and you'd like to help, come and join us - we're a really friendly group of people just trying to do our bit. We'll be meeting in St Cuthbert's Churchyard on Sunday 24th March from 2pm to do some bee-friendly planting. If you'd like to catch us sooner, we're holding an afternoon tea with a "Gardening for Wildlife" theme in The Memorial Hall on Sunday 17th March 2-4pm. Come and meet us, have a chat and enjoy a drink and a piece of cake. We'd love to meet you!

Finally, if you'd like to make your garden more wildlife-friendly but can't decide how to make a start, I'd be more than happy to help with ideas, advice or a visit to have a chat with you. Please do get in touch so that we can make a difference!

Refurbishment of St Aidan's Hall

A frozen pipe and water leak has set back the refurbishment plan but it was already planned to replace the carpet and laminate floor so there will be no extra costs. Thank you to all the volunteers who stepped in to make repairs and clean up so that none of the weekend bookings were affected. The Luncheon Club is very popular and a social event was organised by Shirdley Hill Community Association, to celebrate a resident's 85th Birthday.

Report from Traffic & Road Safety Group

Lots of comments were posted on Halsall Facebook about the potholes opening up yet again on Gregory's Lane mini-roundabout. The Parish Council escalated this need for repeated work to LCC Highways. We have received a report that this section of the road needs a through resurfacing and this will be scheduled but until then LCC will continue to repair any potholes on a temporary basis.

Potholes and Flooding

The Love Clean Streets app available on phones or computers. Anyone can use this, so please go ahead and report blocked drains and potholes. It would be better if more substantial permanent repairs were done but problems do get fixed it you report them.

Restoration of Ancient public footpaths in Halsall

This article last month has attracted the attention of West Lancs Open Spaces who have asked for a meeting to coordinate activity. Once the weather improves we will be looking volunteers to walk the recognised paths and report back. In the autumn we did some work on Carr Moss to Plex Moss, Plex Lane to Dicconson's, Plex Moss to Barton, and a look at Halsall Cutting which is very overgrown.

Halsall Parish Council - Council Tax

The Parish Council receives a small proportion of residents' Council Tax. Increased revenue from St Aidan's Hall, means the Council can reduced its precept by 9.5%. The Band D payment for Halsall Parish will be £33.56, which will be £29,436 total for next financial year.

<u>Halsall St Cuthbert's</u> <u>March Report</u>

Admissions

Demand for places at Halsall St Cuthbert's is likely to be strong again this year and we hope to welcome 25 children into the reception class in September 24. Experience days and a Parents' Information meeting will be planned for later in the summer term.

Clarification regarding School Admissions

In February's Parish Council report, there was a statement expressing a concern that local children may be being excluded from Halsall St Cuthbert's Primary School whilst those from further away are being accepted.

All parents have the right to apply for a place for their child to attend Halsall St Cuthbert's. All applications are then ranked using the agreed Admissions Criteria, endorsed by Liverpool Diocese and the LEA.

As St Cuthbert's is a voluntary-aided Church of England Primary School, these criteria give preference to those parents who show their Christian commitment by worshipping on a regular basis. (please refer to the <u>Admissions Criteria</u> on the school website)

Once the Admissions Number is met (25) all parents who are not initially offered a place for their child, have the right of appeal to the LEA. The school actively encourages parents to appeal, as very often the school is able to accept more than the Admissions Number. As far as I am aware, no parent who has followed advice and has made a formal appeal to the LEA/school, has failed to gain a reception place for their child at Halsall St Cuthbert's. It may be that the Parish Council statement, refers to parents who did not wish to follow the official Appeal Process and therefore weren't offered a place for their child. This is very unfortunate.

School Crossing Officer

The school is still suffering from the loss of its Road Crossing Officer and this is a major issue. Parents are often struggling to cross the very busy main road with their children and this is something that needs addressing as a matter of urgency. Lancashire County Council is responsible for Road Crossing staff so please voice your worries and concerns to the Council.

It has been suggested that school staff should be deployed to support the parents and children crossing the road. Many members of staff have volunteered but unfortunately, any such action is not supported by the LCC and the staff would have no insurance cover. **Football**
