The Rector Writes

Liverpool Diocese has long understood the complexities around the region's connection with the transatlantic slave trade. There is ongoing debate about how churches should respond to the reality that some of their historic wealth came from the profits of the slave trade in the form of Queen Anne's Bounty. This was a fund set up in the eighteenth century to help supplement the income of poor clergy and which is now part of the money managed by the Church Commissioners.

The Queen Anne's Bounty invested significant funds in the South Sea Company, a company that traded in enslaved people. It also received numerous benefactions, many of which are likely to have come from individuals linked to, or who profited from, transatlantic chattel slavery or the plantation economy.

In addition, many churches had benefactors who were directly involved in the slave trade. It is perhaps no great surprise, given our proximity to the port of Liverpool, that St Cuthbert's falls into that category, as an article elsewhere in this newsletter highlights.

This is a complex and sensitive subject. How should St Cuthbert's respond? As a place of worship dedicated to the worship of God, it is key that, as far as we are able, all are made to feel welcome. It is also important to recognise that this not just a historic issue but one that is still a reality for many today. Modern day slavery may look different, but it is still sadly very much present in our modern world.

Whilst St Cuthbert's does not have grand monuments to slave traders, as other churches do, we have a duty to humbly admit that some of our historic wealth has come from this evil trade and, in doing so, recognise that as Christians we are called to live in a different way.

Over the next few months the Parochial Church Council (PCC) will be considering how we acknowledge St Cuthbert's connection with the slave trade and how we can speak up to challenge modern slavery, and in doing so try to build a better world.

Halsall's Patrons, A questionable past

In the 19th century Halsall St Cuthbert's was a rich parish. It had had some very wealthy patrons in the past, including the Earl of Macclesfield and the Mordaunts. The patron was important not just to the church but to the village.

The Advowson (deeds) of the church were a lucrative prospect when they became available for sale at the end of the 18th century and Jonathan Blundell, who had made a fortune in the trans-Atlantic slave trade from Liverpool, bought the advowson so that his brother Thomas could benefit from the living as Rector, with a good income from glebe lands and church tithes. Shipping was in the family and his father Bryan Blundell had captained the Mulberry, which transported a large number of slave workers to Virginia and was the first ship to berth in the Old Dock in Liverpool in 1715.

During the 18th century Liverpool was Britain's main slaving port. Between 1700 and 1807, ships from Liverpool carried approximately 1.5 million Africans across the Atlantic in conditions of great cruelty. Most Liverpool ships went first to Africa and then to the islands of the Caribbean and Virginia in the American colonies, where captains sold the men, women and children as slaves to plantation owners. His son Jonathan was the sole owner of the slave ship Tarleton which, on one recorded voyage, landed 236 of its 273 slaves in Barbados having embarked them from the Gold Coast. The Blundell's sons and descendants continued to build wealth from the transatlantic slave trade throughout the 18th century.

Liverpool controlled more than half of the European trade and surpassed London and Bristol. Wealth was amassed and, consequently, much of the city's growth and development was based on profits of the slave trade.

There were 111 known voyages over six decades, when slaves were sold in West Indies and the American colonies, the ships returned to Liverpool with sugar, cotton and tobacco. One sixth of captured Africans died on voyages in the cruel and crammed conditions. Most slaves came from Senegal, Ivory Coast, Ghana, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Congo, Gabon, and Angola. One sixth of captured Africans died on voyages in the cruel and crammed conditions.

The Blundells kept the patronage of the church throughout the 19th and 20th centuries. After slavery was abolished the descendants of the Blundells turned their attention to mining for coal. They were philanthropic, building schools and a church for mining communities in Orrel near Wigan. When Rector Thomas Blundell Hollinshead Blundell came to the living of St Cuthbert's in 1870 he had a new rectory built across the road from the church. Great expenditure was lavished upon the church in stained glass and ornate lecterns and his brother Henry Hollinshead Blundell financially supported the foundation of the new school in Halsall with his generosity.

The Rector Thomas and his wife Adelaide were much loved for their support of the village and villagers. However, though slavery had been abolished in 1833 his brother Henry Hollinshead Blundell was still using child labour in the mines until 1900. It could be argued that the Blundells in their generosity to the church and village were atoning for the mistakes of the past. They had made much of their wealth in the mines of Pemberton, Orell and Wigan but the profit of that wealth had its origins in African slaves.

I began research on this subject in June 2023 after a visit to the Bluecoat chambers in Liverpool which led me to linking slavery to Jonathan Blundell one of the Halsall patrons listed in Bullough's book. It was a long shot because Blundell is a common name however, the link was established when the Mordaunts previous patrons advertised the church for sale among the business and commerce classes in Liverpool and Jonathan Blundell responded. The story behind this is referenced in my article in the Lancashire Archive magazine November 2023.

Friends of the Green (FROGS) update 2024

As I'm sure you are all aware, this excessively wet winter has been somewhat of a challenge for the FROGS. However, we have managed to make some progress in our efforts to further improve our surroundings. We have planted several hundred daffodil, tulip, and mixed selection spring bulbs and most of the pots have been replanted. New roses have been added to the beds, plus some additional perennials. Sadly, we lost five mature willows due to the high winds and boggy ground. To compensate for this 25 whips have been planted in a nursery bed but these will only be ready to plant out as young sapling trees in a few years time. The fallen trees have all been cut up into logs and distributed to local residents with log burners. A plum tree and a pear tree have been added to the orchard and two other trees are in transit.

I'm also pleased to tell you that a very generous local resident has offered to supply a shaded tree ring bench (in the hope of a hot summer).

All of this work is possible because of the very kind and generous support we receive from you the residents, in your attendance at the various functions held at St Aidans, and on the Village Green. Speaking of which, Noel with the support of the newly formed community association has organised a full programme of events running throughout the summer; please attend when possible.



Report from Traffic & Road Safety Group

PARKING

Cars double parking and parking on pavements are causing problems. Please can residents park in their driveways if possible and leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow prams and wheelchairs to get through. The Council frequently receives complaints about parents parking inconsiderately during the school run to St Cuthbert's School.

Potholes and Flooding

Parking in the Halsall Area

Congestion around both the school and the church at certain times of the day is always going to be high. The vast, vast majority of parents and visitors park responsibly and considerately. A small number however do not. This is mainly because they only want to walk as short a distance as possible to get to the church or the school playground. We have had reports of people parking across driveways (so residents can't go out until they return) people double-parking and narrowing the road so that large vehicles (buses and tractors) cannot pass through and have to turn around and find an alternative route through. Sometimes people park in the private car parks of local businesses such as Bambers Solicitors (taking both staff and client spaces), they park on blind bends, they park in the disabled spaces in school (and they are not even disabled) they park in the bus layby or in the time-restricted areas along Carr Moss Lane. Bees and Butterflies Brigade

Thank you to all of you who helped to get our churchyard planting off to a great start in March! Spring will help our new plants establish and bear colourful, bee-friendly flowers! April is a busy time of year for our pollinating insects as they seek to build up their strength after hibernation and look for suitable places to rear their young. Gardens play a vital role in their success so, if you are thinking of re-stocking your garden this April, please spare a thought for special creatures like honey bees, bumble bees, hoverflies, butterflies and moths – your choice of plant is important.

One of the most helpful things we can do in our gardens is fill them full of flowering plants. These provide nectar (carbohydrate) and pollen (protein) to beneficial insects and, like us, they need a balanced and varied diet to be healthy. So, the key to your plant choices should be "variety". Choose to plant a range of different plants in your garden and try to include plants that have different shapes and sizes of flower. This will provide a choice of pollen and nectar for insects and encourage a wide variety of visitors. So, for example, the tubular flowers of foxglove favour bumblebees – it's amazing to watch them disappear inside – whilst the flattish heads of yarrow favour hoverflies. Some plants, such as the open, saucer-like flowers of geranium "Rozanne", attract both small bumblebees and honey bees and they are long-flowering into the bargain. Avoid plants with overly-frilly or double flowers as these make it hard for bees to access the center of the flower and little nectar is gained for their effort.

Try to make sure that there is something in flower in your garden during each season of the year. This means that insects will keep coming back, knowing that they can find food. Oriental hellebores and lungwort (in a shady spot) are fantastic food plants for bees in the spring; aquilegias, catmint, geranium and poppies flower in early summer, echinacea and verbena are magnets for bees and butterflies in mid-to-late summer and ice-plant or michaelmas daisies are vital late sources of nectar for many insects. Include key plants like these in your gardens and you will help beneficial insects to thrive through the year. If you are a novice gardener and plant names are daunting, please don't give up – plants in garden centers are usually labelled and there is a handy little bee logo to look out for on the labels, which indicates a pollinator-friendly plant. Try planting up a few pots with bee-friendly plants and place them in a sunny, sheltered spot – passing bees may well use these as a pit-stop!

If you'd like support with your plant choices, I'd be more than happy to help with ideas, advice or a visit to have a chat with you. Please do get in touch. Alternatively, come along to the next meeting of "The Bs" in St. Cuthbert's Churchyard, 2pm on Sunday 21st April – we'll be sowing wild flower seed!
