The Rector Writes

Bishop John, in his letter to the parishes this year, talked about finding calm this Christmas. My first thought was that is a major challenge in so many ways. Ongoing conflicts across the world seem to be stuck in a gruelling cycle of attack and counter attack, with no indication the conflicts are calming. At home many people feel disillusioned with the state of the world. Many are struggling to make ends meet, others feel there is just not enough time to balance family and work life, let alone the additional burdens of caring for older relatives or the wider community. In addition, at this time of year church life moves at a faster pace, with additional services, visits to be made and school assemblies to be delivered. It does not feel calm!

Silent Night, Mohr and Gruber's famous carol reputedly first performed on Christmas Eve over 200 years ago, still provides a moment to quietly reflect on the transcendent moment of Christ's incarnation. Through the inevitable trauma of labour and childbirth comes the time when all is still and we can sleep in heavenly peace. While the shepherds are quaking and the choirs of angels are singing, at the centre is the calming presence of Jesus. Jesus, who later would calm the storm, who would create time for prayer and solitude in the midst of his busy ministry, and who would stand calmly defiant in the face of the persecution that led to his victory on the cross.

Calm, of course, is not the absence of activity. It is something more profound than that. Calm comes when, despite the frenetic activity of Christmas preparations and the chaos of life, we know deep within our spirits that in Christ all is well, and all will be well.

This Christmas, let us try to find some calm in our own lives and within our community. Let's come together to hear a different message that speaks of calm, mutual respect and hope - not anger, division and despair. Let's heed the words of another famous carol: 'Oh hush the noise ye men of strife, and hear the angels sing.'

May the peace of Christ dwell in you this Christmas time and be your inspiration in the coming year; Susan

ANIMALS OF THE BIBLE PUZZLE COLUMN

47. Birds in the Wilderness

N these notes, we have now considered about fifty creatures, great and small, which are mentioned in

the Holy Scriptures. Some of the more familiar animals were of immense importance to the early Hebrews, for they were almost entirely dependent on them for their living. These were the animals, domesticated in man's early ages, that are still as essential to mankind to-day. Others, probably known to countrydwellers, find mention in the Bible

 only in literary and metaphorical pas- sages, while many are referred to incidentally, perhaps in a single verse,
 or else are found in contexts which
 give little help in identifying them; · such are some of those animals pro- hibited as food to the Israelites, listed in Leviticus, chapter 11, where it is
 virtually impossible to know just what · kind of things they were.

For instance, the bird referred to as a swan can hardly have been the huge water-fowl that we know so well, and the Vulgate is perhaps nearer the mark when it uses the word 'Ibis.' 'Cormorant' also seems to have been

a water bird, probably a sea bird, but the word which is so translated in two of the three passages is elsewhere

rendered pelican. We sometimes hear the expression 'a pelican in the wilderness,' and knowing this strange bird's fishing habits, we ask ourselves how such an expression could possibly be correct, but in this we should realize that the Biblical wilderness was merely a desolate, lonely place; it might or might not be the desert that we usually picture it to

be. John the Baptist is pictured living in the wilderness, but yet he did his preaching in the valley of the River Jordan, where he used to baptize his

By the time you read this note I hope that I shall have paid my first visit to the Holy Land to see, in their own natural surroundings, many of the creatures about which I have been writing. I hope that I shall then be in a better position to complete a book on the animals of the Bible that I have long been wanting to write.



We have dug out brambles, barrowed soil, piled logs, sowed seeds, put in plants, made habitats and planted bulbs.....all with a sense of doing something good together. That's a great feeling to have! Thank you to everyone who has helped to give nature a home – you are all amazing! A special thank you goes to our Parish Council, for helping us to fund our planting, and to all those in the church and local businesses who have enabled us to achieve so much.

There is no doubt that being outside and connecting with nature is good for us, especially if we take the time to be peaceful and notice what is going on around us. Make a plan this winter to dodge the worst of the weather and get outside if you can. Aim for the woods or the local canal-side, try to have no fixed destination and don't feel you have to rush back. As you explore, take the time to engage as many senses as you can. What does the air feel like on your skin? Is it cool or frosty? Can you smell damp earth or decomposing leaves? What can you hear? Is it the song of a wren or robin? Or is it a blackbird scuffing up leaves to find insects? Do you see the spider making a web amongst the twigs and branches? Can you sense that there is more life out there, hidden from view? Stop and stand or sit for a moment and try to feel closer to nature – feel that you belong in this place. Special, connected moments can give us hope that everything will be alright; they can help us put our worries in perspective and give us solace or joy.

Recently, I found beautiful holly and ivy entwined together in a hedge – look closely and it's a world of shapes, patterns, lines and textures (ouch), woven to perfection.



You can find lots of ideas to help you connect with nature at wwf.org.uk, (World Wide Fund for Nature) – just click on "Get your daily dose" and explore the different options. There are great ideas for adults and children and you can send off for a free pack which includes a nature journal to get you started. I've got mine already!

The Bees and Butterflies Brigade will next meet outdoors in late winter/early spring 2025 and we have plenty of plans for the year ahead. Do join us if you can and whatever you do this winter, have a happy one.


