Renewal of the Church Electoral Roll in 2025

Every five years each parish must renew its electoral roll. This is a list of people who wish to be part of the Church and is a way of demonstrating your willingness to help shape the future of the Church. By being on the roll it enables you to participate and vote in the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

To be entitled to be included on the Electoral Roll, a person must have:

- 1. been Baptised, and
- 2. attained their sixteenth birthday on or before the date of the annual parochial church meeting, **and**
- 3. submitted a signed application form for enrolment, **and** must be one of the following:
- i. a member of the Church of England, or of a Church in communion with the Church of England, and resident in the parish; **or**
- ii. a member of the Church of England and, not being resident in the parish, to have habitually attended public worship in the parish during a period of six months prior to enrolment; **or**
- a member in good standing of a Church which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity (not being a Church in communion with the Church of England) and also prepared to declare himself to be a member of the Church of England having habitually attended public worship in the parish during a period of six months prior to enrolment.

You can be on the Roll of several parishes if you fulfil the above criteria, but can only use one parish for the purposes of membership of the PCC, elections to synods, etc.

Living in the parish will not automatically add you to the electoral roll nor will coming to church regularly or giving regularly. You must fill in a new form.

Please collect a form from the back of church or contact one of the parish officers to get one.

Halsall News Of Yesteryear—February 1965

The Rectory, Halsall, 13th January, 1965

My dear Friends.

Above all, maintain church attendances, and if you have become a little irregular in this matter, try to come at least once a Sunday.

Each Lent I have noticed that some members of our congregation make a point of attending 8 o'clock Holy Communion every Sunday, as well as one of the other services. May there be more who adopt this practice this year.

Make a good start, Celebrations of Holy Communion on Ash Wednesday are at 7 a.m. and 10 a.m.

FOR THE CHILDREN

Dear children.

Thank you very much for helping with the gift envelopes for the children at Quarry Mount, Ormskirk. You will be pleased to know that over £10 was sent in and we are very grateful to you for all you did to help.

This month I am going to talk to you about the most wonderful prayer in the world. The Lord's Prayer, Our Father,

Jesus used to pray to God, His Father, very often. Sometimes He made long prayers, and at other times they were very short ones: like suddenly thinking about God or saying "Please God, help me now this minute."

Now, Peter and James and John, and the other friends of the Lord Jesus who went everywhere with Him, eating their meals with Him and sleeping with Him—sometimes out of doors which must have been fun in summer—saw that Jesus talked with our Father God. That made them want to do it, too, but when Peter and John said their prayers, they didn't quite know what to say to God.

So, one day, they waited till Jesus had finished His prayers and when He got up they said: "Please, Lord Jesus, teach us how to say our prayers. What shall we say?"

"First of all," said Jesus, "think of God your Heavenly Father," (We can think of Jesus Himself, too.). There is God, with all His holy angels near Him, praising Him and saving: 'Holy, holy, holy, holy, "Then," said Jesus, "say: 'OUR FATHER WHICH ART IN HEAVEN, HALLOWED BE THY NAME,"

"Next," said Jesus, "we must ask God to help us to do all the things that please Him—the good kind things—so that Heaven will come in our homes. Say: "THY KINGDOM COME THY WILL BE DONE, IN EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN."

"Shall we ask God, now, to give us our food?" said Jesus, "God knows how much we need dinner every day and so we ought to ask Him to help people to make food for us and say: "GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD."

"Another thing we want to ask God," said Jesus, "is that He will forgive all His children when they have been naughty and are sorry. So we must forgive people if they are naughty to us and say they are sorry.

"Now," said Jesus, "we want God our Father to dake care of us, He wants to take care of us because He loves us. He wants to keep us safe near Him, for He will protect all His little children in danger if we ask Him, so we will say: "LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION, BUT DELIVER US FROM EVIL."

Now ask Mum to read you this story from the Bible. She will find it in St. Matthew, Chapter 6, verses 9-16, St. Mark, chapter 2, verses 25-27 and St. Luke, chapter 2, verses 1-5.

THE IMPORTANCE OF LENT

The word itself is derived from an Anglo-Saxon word meaning to lengthen or to grow. It is the custom of the church to set aside this period of time before Easter in order to help her members to grow in the knowledge and in the love of God,

There is nothing mournful or doleful about a properly observed Lent. The old fashioned idea of having dismal hymns at this time of year is quite unnecessary and out of place. When a boy is in love it is not a hardship for him to be in the company of his beloved. If you really and truly love God coming to worship Him would be a delight and not just a duty.

Friendship can only develop when two persons develop one another's acquaintance. In the same way friendship with God can only be fostered and strengthened by being with God and by learning more about Him. Therefore, the more time we devote to the duties of prayer and worship, the stronger our friendship with God is likely to become. Lent is therefore, a time when we try and do this.

I urge you to try and attend the Holy Communion on Ash Wednesday, Almost everyone could come to either of the celebrations.

Practical suggestions:

- YOUR DAILY PRAYERS. These are vital yet so many of us often forget them.
- REGULAR WORSHIP. One attendance at Church on Sunday is necessary to fulfil the minimum requirements of normal Christian duty. Try not to be too fixed in your habits.



Bees & Butterflies Brigade were awarded a S137 grant of £500 for their plans for Spring planting in the Memorial Garden, St Cuthberts churchyard.

<u>Halsall Proud & Tidy</u> also received £500 towards their work for Lancashire's Best Kept Village competition.

<u>Parish Council Tax for 2025/26</u> The parish council have submitted a request to WLBC for £34,546. This averages out to £37.67 per Band D household, about 73p per week.

This is a slight increase from £37.09 in 2023/24 and £4 more than £33.56 for 2024/25 but this benefited from one-off higher than expected incomes.

Yes - there's lots to do and that's apart from starting our pre-planned major project of clearing and planting the large sloping bank that runs adjacent to the main road.

We need to prep this area to get rid of all those pesky bindweed roots and reduce the amount of nettles and be ready to start planting in March. Clare Edwards has very kindly put together a planting scheme for us which will attract birds bees & butterflies as well as stabilising the bank.

The Bees and Butterflies Brigade - February 2025

Hello everyonel It's the start of another year and I hope you are all ready to go! After avery wet spring last year, UK numbers of bees, butterflies and moths were significantly down according to charities like "Butterfly Conservation" – this is an indication that insects of all sorts need our support more than ever. So do those amazing species that depend on insects to thrive, such as birds, bats and hedgehogs. It's important to stay positive, though, and remember that insects can breed and recover relatively quickly if we give them somewhere peaceful to live, free from pesticides and with plenty of food and shelter. So, what have "The Bs" got planned for 2025?

Our main focus is to continue to develop the Memorial Garden at St. Cuthbert's into just such a haven, one that both people and wildlife can enjoy. The first job of the year is to lift and divide some of the large clumps of snowdrops that grow there, so we can spread this pretty, winter-flowering plant through the new area of woodland-style planting. The best time to do this is after the snowdrops have flowered, when the leaves are still green. Snowdrops do not rely on pollination by insects to propagate themselves; they spread by growing new bulbs underground. However, they do still produce plenty of nectar. This will feed hungry bees that venture out of hibernation on the warmer winter days – canny bees will tuck themselves right inside the snowdrop flower to e-fuel!

We also have some bird boxes to put up to support some of the woodland birds that we already have in the village – particularly great-tits and blue-tits. Bird boxes can provide vital roosting and breeding places for birds, especially when situated where insects and berrying shrubs thrive. I'll be talking about how to site a bird box successfully and how to protect nesting birds from predators such as woodpeckers and squirrels.

If you'd like to get outside, join in and feel involved with nature then please do get in touch or come along and help with these activities. Don't worry if you are not a "gardener" – you'll soon get the hang of it and you'll be supported all the way.

We'll be meeting in St Cuthbert's Churchyard on Sunday 23rd February from 2pm to make a start. We'd love to meet you!


